Luis was the first participant in the United States to complete the Broadly Experienced Foreign Architects (BEFA) program through the National Council of Architectural Registration Board (NCARB) in 2006, resulting in his receiving an NCARB Certificate in June 2007 and an Architectural License for the State of Wyoming in July 2007.
